



SUMMER CAMP 2022

All of our camps are designed to accommodate both able-bodied/neuro-typical riders and those with mental and/or physical disabilities. Each session will have a maximum of ten campers and campers will be asked to abide by COVID safe practices as deemed necessary by GaitWay staff.

Sessions:

- Session 1: Advanced Horsemanship, July 11th - July 15th (Ages 11 and up)
- Session 2: Beginner Horsemanship, July 18th - July 22nd (Ages 6 to 12)
- Session 3: Beginner Horsemanship, July 25th - July 29th (Ages 6 to 12)
- Session 4: Beginner Horsemanship, August 1st - August 5th (Ages 6 to 12)

Cost:

- \$300 for the week or \$75 per day (minimum two day attendance)
- \$100 non-refundable deposit required at registration

Registration:

- Adaptive riders will be required to have an additional Physician's Assessment filled out prior to enrollment.
- Your registration will not be complete until the office has received your completed registration forms and the \$100 non-refundable deposit. You will be contacted to confirm completed registration in our camps.

Times: All camps run from 8AM – 2PM

- Campers will need to be signed in and out every day.
- Earliest drop off time is 7:30 AM.
- Aftercare is available from 2PM – 6PM every day at a charge of \$15 per hour. Campers not picked up by 2:30 PM will automatically be considered in aftercare.
- Please notify us ahead of time if you plan to pick up your camper before 2PM on any day.
- On the first day of each session paperwork will be available to fill out regarding photograph/image permissions, confidentiality, liability, medications, allergies, and individuals authorized for pickup, be prepared for delays. If someone other than a legal parent/guardian will be dropping off on the first day, please contact the office about filling out this paperwork ahead of time.
 - For Beginner Camps (6-12 years old) only individuals on the Authorized Pickup List will be allowed to sign out campers with a legal photo ID.



Dress Code:

- Two shirts will be provided to campers on the first day and must be worn all week long.
- Closed toed shoes must be worn at all times (boots are strongly preferred).
- Jeans or Equestrian riding pants are to be worn. Campers may bring shorts of an appropriate length to change into for aftercare activities.

What to Bring Daily:

- 2 healthy snacks, a lunch (microwave and refrigerator are available), and a water bottle all must be labeled with camper's name
- Sunscreen and bug spray with camper's name, must be able to be administered by camper.
- Any allergy medications/ regular medications must be labeled with the camper's name and must have a specialized form filled out by parent/guardian.
- Beach towel
- Helmets are available, but campers may bring their own riding helmet if it is ASTM approved.
- Single bag in which all of the camper's belongings can be contained.
- **We strongly discourage campers from bringing money or electronic entertainment devices. GaitWay staff and volunteers will not hold items for campers at any time and GaitWay is not responsible for items becoming damaged, lost, or stolen.**

Contact:

- Campers are prohibited from having phones on their person while engaging in camp activities.

Last Day – Horse Show:

- On the last day of camp, campers can bring washable paint, washable glitter, hair rubber bands, and hair ribbons to decorate their horse for the horse show.
- Items that need to be secured to the horse or tack such as hats, necklaces, or capes will not be permitted.
- Parents and family are encouraged to come out from 1PM – 2PM and view the show. We ask that there be no flash photography while our riders are mounted.
- Carrots, apples, and peppermints can be brought to give the horses, but please make a sure a staff member is present when feeding treats to any horse on our property.
- We love seeing young siblings coming out to watch big brother or big sister ride, we just ask for their safety that they aren't left unattended or allowed to wander freely around the horses.
